1. Artistic Assessment

1.1 Please evaluate the artistic quality of the event - its Vision and Imagination; Ability to Communicate and Quality of Production.

A production that attempted to address contemporary issues with universal applications. The result was disappointingly uneven, and failed to engage fully.

1.2 You are also asked to assess the strengths and weaknesses of the event with specific reference to the following:

- **Script (particularly in relation to new work, or second productions)**

The script was hampered by an ill-advised attempt to represent a supposed language barrier through the use of a stilted form of English. This contrasted markedly with the easy flow of the interrogatee's naturalistic speeches which were skilfully constructed. His final lyrical passages were the highlight of the piece. Regrettably these did not compensate for the staccato, dis-jointed language of the bulk of the play which made up the inter-active scenes. I thought that the structure was, interesting, with characters speaking the same lines overlapping. The plot lines started apart and gradually converged to a satisfying finish.

Joseph's speeches painted vivid word pictures which had the gems of a really good radio play.

- **Direction**

The direction was generally jerky and unsatisfying. The monologues were well presented, but the scenes involving the other characters were awkward, and poorly paced.

- **Standard of performers**

Liam Brennan's performance was eminently watchable and was the most positive aspect of the production. He was a believable character with a palpable history. The other performances were adequate, but one did not have the sense that the actors understood or believed in who they were portraying.

- **Design**

The set was fairly neutral. The element that worked best was the suggested cave paintings that took on their suggested significance at the appropriate point. The water feature was rather under-stated and, therefore, lacked impact. Costumes were fine. The lighting was unremarkable. The set did not actually succeed in creating the sense of the characters actually being in a cave.

Altogether this production failed to stimulate. One could see glimmers of understanding and enlightenment in the script, but the use of language seemed to ultimately stifle this. It was a fairly dull evening, enlivened only by Liam Brennan's performance.

In principle, it was the type of production that one would expect to suit the Tron.

The house was only around quarter full (if that). The response was muted and any comments I overheard were not positive. There were one or two audience members who whooped at the end, but I feel that was unrepresentative.
